

HOMOPHONES 'two', 'too', 'to'

- Homophones are words that sound the same but have different spellings and mean different things
- 'Two' is the **number 2**
- 'Too' can mean '**as well**' - *Jack has a dog and Tia has one too.*
- 'Too' can also show an amount that is '**over a limit**' - *This box is too big to pick up.*
- 'To' shows **direction** - *I am going to school.*
