

## SPEECH MARKS (end of sentence)

- Speech marks look like this “ ”
- Speech marks are used to show the exact words spoken by someone
- Speech marks can often be at the end of a sentence (shown in blue)

### Point to the speech marks

- The words within the speech marks is called direct speech
- Remember each piece of direct speech starts with a capital letter (shown in blue)

- There is always a comma after a reporting verb and before the direct speech (shown in blue)
