

## SUBJECT PRONOUNS

- A noun is the name of a person, place or thing
- A pronoun can take the place of a noun

I            you            he            she            it            we            they

All of these are pronouns and can be the subject of this sentence:

\_\_\_\_\_ went out.

- Sometimes we use the same noun too much when we could use a pronoun instead
