

## TEACHHANDWRITING WEBSITE

To find which worksheets will be most appropriate, go to the 'shop' page <https://teachhandwriting.co.uk/shop.html> and click on 'home schemes'. Click on one of the 'choose' buttons and then 'which level' from the menu. Click on download and you will be asked for your email address where you will receive a free download link. Use the worksheet level assessment provided on the download to work out which sheet will be best for your child.

The website offers three types of worksheets: **beginners** (which has pictures and colours to help position letters on the writing line); **refiners** (which just has colours) and **lined** (which just has lines).

Within each of the three types of worksheet there are also three sizes of line height. **Beginner's level 1** is the **largest** line height while **refiners** and **lined level 3** are the **smallest** which is the recommended size to stop at.

Get the child to write the letters 'a', 'b' and 'g' on what you think is the appropriate level for them (if they are able to). Always start at a line height the child is comfortable with. To begin with 'big is beautiful'.
