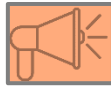


TEMPERATURE (hot, warm, cool, cold)



We feel heat through our skin. The skin then sends nerve signals to our brain. The brain tells us how hot or cold something is.

A cup of tea that has just been made with boiling water will burn our mouth if we try to drink it. It is too **hot** to drink.

Jumpers and coats often make us feel **warm** when we put them on.

If we are having a bath, after a while, the water becomes **cool**. We will then probably get out of the bath.

An ice lolly from the freezer may be too **cold** to bite into. We will probably just want to lick it as it melts.
